

What to expect. July 2020 Version 3.0



Psalm 122:1 - I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'

The good news is that St Peter and St Paul Church, Wincanton is opening for public worship once again. This is being achieved by adhering closely to the Coronavirus guidelines set by our Government and the Church of England. We will need to expect things to be different and provisional. We do not know how long worship will need to be organised in this way, or whether the guidance will loosen or even tighten in the weeks and months ahead. The most important thing is that we worship together as safely as we can adhering closely to the available guidance. As we have been we will endeavour to keep up to date with this guidance and inform as things change.

Until at least the end of August - We are going to start simply and with one act of worship taking place in one of the two churches on a Sunday (St Michael's, Pen Selwood and St Peter and St Paul's, Wincanton). To comply with the guidance, we have had to simplify how we do some matters particularly how many people are involved. Everything everybody usually does is deeply valued, but this is a necessity whilst we bed in the necessary changes in approach. Our first worship services will be simple services of the word, but we will hope to move to sharing communion (*A separate "What to expect" document will be produced for taking communion*).

We will review and make decisions about the worship schedule beyond August depending on how things go. What follows gives us a brief guide of what to expect.

Preparing to come

- It is your decision whether you should be coming to worship at this current time based on your wellbeing. Please be across the latest Government guidance for you, particularly if you are in a vulnerable or extremely vulnerable group. In short, God will understand if coming to worship is not the right decision for you for this season. We will be continuing to provide online reflections (written and video), emailing newsletters and worship resources, and the biweekly mail shot until at least the end of August.
- If you have any symptoms associated with Coronavirus or are self-isolating, please do not attend church for public worship.
- Please bring with you anything you may need (no shared resources will be available – kneelers, cushions, books, toys).
- The guidance on face coverings from the Government and Church of England has changed to the following:- *"Face coverings are currently mandatory on public transport and will be mandatory in shops and in supermarkets from 24 July 2020. People are also encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a place of worship. We strongly advise that face coverings should be worn by all those attending a place of worship, including ministers, worshippers, staff, volunteers, contractors and visitors, where there may be other people present; remembering that they are mainly intended to protect other people, not the wearer, from coronavirus COVID-19 and that they are not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing"*.
- Prepare a slip of paper with your name and phone number on it.

Arriving

- Come to the South Door of the church.
- Put your slip of paper with contact information in the box by the entrance – this is within the requirements of the National Track and Trace system. If you have not brought one – we will need to ask you for your name and phone number when you arrive. These details will be destroyed after 21 days.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and follow the one-way systems in place.
- Put any offering you may wish to give on the plate by the entrance. Giving by standing order remains the safest option for everyone, but you may give with notes / cheques / giving envelopes if you wish at the service as you come in.
- Please sit in one of the spaces where there is an ‘Order of Service’ and keep socially distant from others not in your household. Please ensure you sit at least one meter into any pew away from the aisle.
- Please stay in your seat and prepare to worship quietly.
- A maximum number of worshippers have been identified in our current risk assessment of 50.

Worshipping

- Please speak quietly when giving responses.
- We are not allowed to sing currently – so any music included will be recorded.
- Microphones cannot be shared so it will not be possible to use as many voices as normal during worship.
- The Government guidance is that worship be ‘conducted in the shortest reasonable time’.

Leaving

- Please take the order of service you have handled home with you for disposal.
- Please leave the church quietly as directed by one of the persons leading at the end of the service.
- Please sanitise your hands on exit.
