We hope to be able to welcome you to church this Christmas, and have arranged the following services, which you will be welcome to attend by **booking a seat**:

**Maundy Thursday, 1<sup>st</sup> April – COMMUNION SERVICE at 7:00pm**

**Easter Day, Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> April – COMMUNION SERVICE at 11:00am**

Due to the current restrictions placed on our church by the Government and the Church of England, we have to offer these services at a reduced capacity, and need to ensure your safety at all times. Closing date for bookings is Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> March.

**We are hoping to hold our first Sunday service in Church on March 21<sup>st</sup> at 10am which will include the distribution of palm crosses for use during Holy Week.**

*Preparing to come*

- For some services it will be necessary to book a few days ahead so we can best fill the available space inside the building.
- Coming to Church remains an individual decision to be made carefully and prayerfully. Please refer to the specific guidance from the Government if you are in a vulnerable or extremely vulnerable group.
- If you have any symptoms associated with Coronavirus or are self-isolating, please do not attend church for public worship. (If you have booked a place, please let us know so we can offer your place to someone else).
- Please bring with you anything you may need (no shared resources will be available – kneelers, cushions, books, toys).

- Face coverings are required unless you have a valid exemption.
- Please bring a small pot of hand sanitiser with you if you intend to receive communion.

### Arriving

- Come to the South Door of the church.
- (If this is a service with booking) someone outside will check your booking
- If you are using the NHS track and trace app please scan the QR code which will be on an outside noticeboard by the door. If not, please bring a slip of paper with your name and phone number which will be kept for 3 weeks for tracking and tracing purposes.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and follow the one-way systems in place.
- Put any offering you may wish to give on the plate by the entrance.
- Due to current restrictions *'you must not socialise with people from outside of your household or support bubble while you are indoors.'* This will only change when the 'Rule of Six' applies inside currently provisionally 17<sup>th</sup> May. Also, after March 29<sup>th</sup> it will be possible to socialise outside within the confines of the 'Rule of Six' if it is in place by then.
- Help will be at hand to guide you to your pre-allocated booked seats.
- Please stay in your seat and prepare to worship quietly only socialising within households or household bubbles and maintaining appropriate social distance (2m) from other worshippers.

### Worshipping

- Please speak quietly when giving responses.
- Congregational singing is not allowed currently – so any music included will be played or recorded. A soloist may sing also suitably socially distanced from the congregation and in keeping with guidance for indoor singing.
- Hands must be sanitised immediately before receiving communion.

### Leaving

- Please take the order of service you have handled home with you for disposal.
- Please leave the church quietly as directed by one of the wardens at the end of the service via the South Door.
- Please sanitise your hands on exit.
